U.S. Navy Veteran JJ Wadsworth: Time in service 'best part of my life'

FORT HALL — Jesse James "JJ" Wadsworth said he and Kay Pokibro went to see their buddy Delano Metz off when he enlisted in the U.S. Navy, but they also ended up in the service too.

"So we went down and waved goodbye to him and everything — lo and behold, we ended up in the Navy too!" JJ said as they didn't know the recruiter was there. He looked at us and said, "Oh you guys are all buddies?" "We said 'yeah' and he says well I can get you all in on the buddy system." That was the recruiter's way of getting them interested. "But that's how I ended up in the Navy in 1960," Wadsworth said. "We fell for it."

JJ said he was in his 20s and after joining, the recruiter sent them to Seattle then they caught a flight out of there to San Diego, California for boot camp. They thought they would stick together while in the service, but they were all split up. JJ ended up in Hawaii, Kay went to Long Beach and Delano stayed in San Diego.

Initially JJ said his ship hadn't come in yet so he ended up on Operation Deep Freeze in the South Pole for about four months on an inactive service craft. Then he was on the ship USS Wilhoite 397, a destroyer escort, on his first sea duties. He would spend upwards of a year out on the ocean. After that it was three months at a time out at sea. The ship patrolled the northern Pacific and they were always near Russian ships. "We was keeping an eye on the Russian fleet," he said. The ship would patrol the area and would pass the word on what Russian ships were going out — where they were headed. There were problems between the U.S. and Russia, so if there was a war that broke out, JJ said their ship would have been the first casualties but that didn't happen.

"Their warships would go by us all the time."

They were also shipped south to monitor ships headed towards Vietnam. He was stationed out of Pearl Harbor. He was given the name "Running Bear" while in the Navy just because he was an Indian.

The second ship he served on was the USS Walke, Hull 723. On that ship they escorted aircraft carriers and troop ships.

While on ship, he was a ship fitter, did all the hull work, was a welder and did damage control. He said the ships were old, so he did a lot of repair. He recalled one time there was a big storm that caused a crack in the ship, "that's when I really had to go to work and keep that crack from spreading." It was busy on the ship, there was always something to do, "when they needed things made, I made them, usually at request of the captain or the commander," he continued. On the first ship there was more than 300 crewmen.

JJ said he liked being out on the ocean on board ship despite there not being much out there. However, the air was always fresh — never had any pollution of any kind. Eventually he ended

up in Long Beach, Calif. where he served the rest of his time in the Navy. JJ was honorably discharged in 1965. It was the "best part of my life I had at the time, it made a man out of me, what it did." His time in the Navy taught him a lot and he learned a lot. One thing he did learn about was foreign-

ers — people from Japan, Vietnam. He said he got to know about their ways of life as they had it a lot harder than what we do, their people were mostly poor, noting those in the service, they'd send their money back home to their families.

Shoshone-Bannock culture celebrated at Idaho State-Civic Symphony's 'Songs of the Land'

POCATELLO — The Idaho State-Civic Symphony hosted a concert with Shoshone-Bannock and Okanagan-Similkameen flute soloist Hovia Edwards, composed with Justin Ralls, at the ISU Stephens Performing Arts Center on Saturday, November 2.

The evening began with a pre-show reception where conductor and artistic director Nell Flanders welcomed guests. She explained the concert celebrates the start of Native

American Heritage Month, with a collaboration with Shoshone-Bannock dancers and musicians from the surrounding area.

The reception continued with an interview with composer and flutist Hovia Edwards, and Justin Ralls of Opera Theater Oregon. The symphony showcase was created to highlight a song the pair wrote together called "Farewell," an integration of original Native flute melody and orchestral accompaniment.

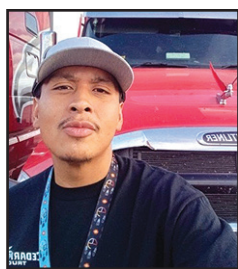

Man who killed eagles gets sentenced to prison term

MISSOULA, Mont. (AP) — A Washington state man accused of leading a wildlife trafficking ring on a Native American reservation that killed thousands of eagles and hawks to sell on the black market was sentenced Thursday to nearly four years in prison.

The trafficking ring operated for years on the Flathead Indian Reservation in northwest Montana, exploiting high demand among tribal members for feathers and other bird parts that are used in powwows and sacred ceremonies.

The defendant and others killed at least 118 eagles, 107 hawks and as many as 3,600 birds overall, prosecutors said.

Juvenile golden eagles in particular were targeted because their black and white feathers are highly desired among Native Americans, officials said.

The poaching operation centered on the Flathead Indian Reservation in northwestern Montana, which researchers say has some of the highest concentrations of eagles and other birds of prey in the U.S. Members of the trafficking ring would set out carcasses of elk, calves and deer, and then shoot eagles that came to feed on them, officials said.

They would also shoot hawks opportunistically off of power poles and other perches.

Travis John Branson, 49, of Cusick, Washington, pleaded guilty in March to charges of conspiracy and wildlife trafficking.

U.S. District Judge Dana Christensen in Missoula said during his sentencing hearing that the killing of birds by Branson was calculated, extensive and carried out with full knowledge that he was breaking the law.

"If you had not been caught you'd still be doing it today," the judge said. Christensen ordered Branson to pay \$777,250 in restitution — \$5,000 for each eagle killed and \$1,750 for each hawk.

sentencing guidelines.

Prior to being sentenced, Branson apologized to the court and his family.

"It's my own fault," he said. "I know what I did was wrong."

In text messages obtained by investigators and presented at the sentencing hearing, Branson wrote of killing birds since the 1980s.

"So many I can't remember anymore LOL," Branson said in one text.

Other texts described eagles being shot in Nevada and Idaho and instances of dozens of birds being shot on a single weekend.

"This is just a small glimpse of the killing that was happening," U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Special Agent Mona Iannelli said during the hearing.

A second defendant in the case told authorities that the trafficking ring had been operating since 2009, killing 300 to 400 birds annually.

Prosecutors from the U.S. Attorney's Office have said others were also involved.

But Branson was described during Thursday's hearing as the organizer of the trafficking ring — instructing others on where and when to shoot birds, and then arranging for the sale of their feathers and parts.

"His lack of respect for the sanctity of these protected birds was driven by only one thing: greed," U.S. Attorney Jesse Laslovich said following the hearing.

Laslovich added that those who purchased the feathers shared responsibility for the killings. The prosecutor said he wanted to put buyers on notice that their conduct is a federal crime.

Prosecutors had asked the judge to impose a "significant" prison sentence and order Branson to pay restitution.

He faced up to five years in prison on the conspiracy charge. His public defender asked for a sentence of probation and claimed that prosecutors overstated the number of birds killed.

Hovia Edwards said she began her flute instrument journey when she was three-years-old, “my father Herman Edwards is a Okanagan-Similkameen from British Columbia, Canada, and he is a flute maker and player like myself. I’m a third-generation flute player, from my grandfather, which is my dad’s father, so it’s a tradition that was passed down in my family.”

Edwards gave a brief history of the flute used by many Native tribes, and their primary uses, including education and ceremonies. The flutes she primarily uses are crafted in a minor key, including the flute she used in the performance, being in a G

minor key, created in Arlee, Mont. by Ken White.

Co-composer Justin Ralls said he met Edwards through friend Rose Ann Abrahamson while he was composing an opera about Sacajawea, titled “Nu Nah-Hup: Sacajawea’s Story,” to learn about the culture and get a perspective from Shoshone people. “Our collaborator Rose Ann and I wanted to share how special Hovia is as a performer and how rare it is, not only for a woman to be a flutist, but also to have her gift for the flute.”

When speaking about the song “Farewell,” Hovia explained it was composed over 10 years prior, “being a professional Native American flute player — it was very stressful, demanding. I started when I was in high school and I lived on the road a lot of the time, and it just got to the point where you get tired of it, and I just wanted to take a break.” She said that the song was the last she wrote before taking a break from touring. “I wanted to spend some time with my family, time on my reservation, and I wanted to live a normal life. I recorded a lot of my music, so this was the last song I recorded of myself before I stopped playing, and then I just put my boots away.” She would later return to flute playing, attending flute workshops in Montana, and meeting different composers, including Ralls.

Ralls said the performance of “Farewell” at the symphony was its world premiere, and it is featured in their upcoming opera about Sacajawea that is nearly complete.

After the interview, a dance showcase preceded the symphony performance from Shoshone-Bannock Jr./Sr. High School dance troupe for guests. Advisor Kara Tsosie talked about each dancers style as Ghost Canyon drummed

for the showcase.

The symphony began with an introduction by Idaho State-Civic Symphony Logan Anderson where he introduced the evening’s events, followed by an address from Idaho State University President Dr. Robert W. Wagner where he acknowledged the Shoshone-Bannock tribal people’s presence in the Southeast Idaho lands.

Fort Hall Business Council Chairman Lee Juan Tendoy spoke to crowd about the Shoshone-Bannock Tribes history and origination in the area. Afterward he sang a song for the audience.

Dustina Abrahamson emceed a traditional dance showcase with dancers Leela Abrahamson, James Tone, Raliah Marshall, Hunter Osborne and Wrendon Osborne. She explained the history of each dance, including both traditional and fancy style from women and men. Ghost Canyon drum group performed the songs for the dancers.

Following the dancers, Hovia Edwards took the stage to lead the world premiere performance of the song “Farewell” with the Idaho State-Civic Symphony.

Sho-Ban Language and Culture Preservation Bannock language apprentice Dillin Diggie played bassoon in the performance of the song with the Idaho State-Civic Symphony.

The symphony performance ended with a “Concerto for Orchestra.” Shoshone-Bannock beadworkers, arts and crafts vendors were also present at the arts center for visitors.

A post-concert reception with a meet and greet with composers, conductors and musicians concluded the night’s events.

Wadsworth comes from a military family. His father William J. Wadsworth was in the U.S. Army. Bud was in the National Guard. Sheridan was in the U.S. Marines and Caddo was in the U.S. Army too.

After his discharge, JJ came back home and went to work. He also met the love of his life Bev Diaz and they married.

He worked at Bannock Steel and later Gate City Steel. He was a carpenter at Boise Cascade building houses at the airport. He then started working at BIA law enforcement in 1969 where he learned both tribal law and federal law. He was also sent to training in Georgia for criminal investigation. Over the years he worked closely with the FBI that

has jurisdiction over major crimes on Indian reservations.

JJ worked 16 years at Fort Hall then transferred to the Nez Perce Reservation in northern Idaho where he retired in 1990. He said the police action was milder at Lapwai than Fort Hall. He didn’t take any “sass” from people when they were detained after working with some of the rugged people in Fort Hall so some of the Lapwai people thought he was mean. Because of his investigation training, he also traveled to the Coeur d’Alene and Kootenai Reservations do work.

In his retirement, JJ continues to do carpentry such as building a deck on his home and welding. He also enjoys camping.
